## IMPORTANT DECISION BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS !!!!!!!!!!!!! POLL FAVORS CHARGE FOR NEWSLETTER !!!!!!!!!!!!!

After reviewing the results of the reader poll, taking into consideration the excessive cost of distributing the Newsletter and carefully deliberating the matter, the Board of Directors has determined that it is not financially feasible to continue distributing 13,278 copies of the Newsletter free of charge to everyone on the National TD Roster.

The Board has further determined, albeit reluctantly, that henceforth, commencing with the next issue of the Newsletter (i.e No. 12), the Newsletter will be sent only to those readers who want and request it by filling out and returning the printed form appearing in this edition.

In Newsletter No.10 readers were asked to respond to the query whether a charge should be assessed annually for four quarterly issues of the Newsletter.

As this Newsletter goes to press we have received a total of 400 responses from some 13,278 recipients of the Newsletter. Of the 400 that did respond, however, an overwhelming number of 392 were unequivocally in favor of an annual tax-deductible contribution or charge of \$10.
