






THE MEMORIALS MAGNIFICENT CENTERPIECE

SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF MEMORIAL

SUPPORT ERECTION OF THE ARMORED FORCES MOMUNEMED AT THE ENTRANCE AREA OF ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY AS A MEMORIAL TO HONOR OUR ARMORED FORCES This is an urgent call to action to support Resolution by the delegates at the 90th National Convention of the Wars of the United States in Las Vegas, Nevada, August 18-25, 1990.

With a scheduled dedication data for the Armored Forces Honument on Veterans Day, November 11, 1998, the Armored Forces Honument Committee has stated, "400,000 is needed to srect the Honument and approximately \$200,000 has been raised." Accordingly, total funding must be completed to permit construction to begin in June 1990.

The U.S. Army Armor Center and Fort Knox was host to 10,000 visitors July 18 for a day-long celebration in honor of the 50th anniversary of the creation of the Armored Force. By all indications, the day was a tremendous success, highlighted by the dedication of Armor Memorial Park with its impressive new entrance by the Patton Museum.

A major part of our 58th anniversary celebration extending into 1995 is special recognition of the sacrifice and dedication of all armored divisions, separate tank and tank destroyer battalions, and mechanized cavalry units, during World War II and afterwards. As Chief of Armor, I am presenting to each of these unit associations a commemorative coin struck especially to honor Armor's golden anniversary.

The coin is small, but what it represents in terms of lives lost, injuries suffered and the bereavement of anguished families is incalculable. I reserved a coin for the Tank Destroyer Association as a token of what Armor has done, and will continue to do, in defense of America's freedom and that of peace-loving countries throughout the world.
