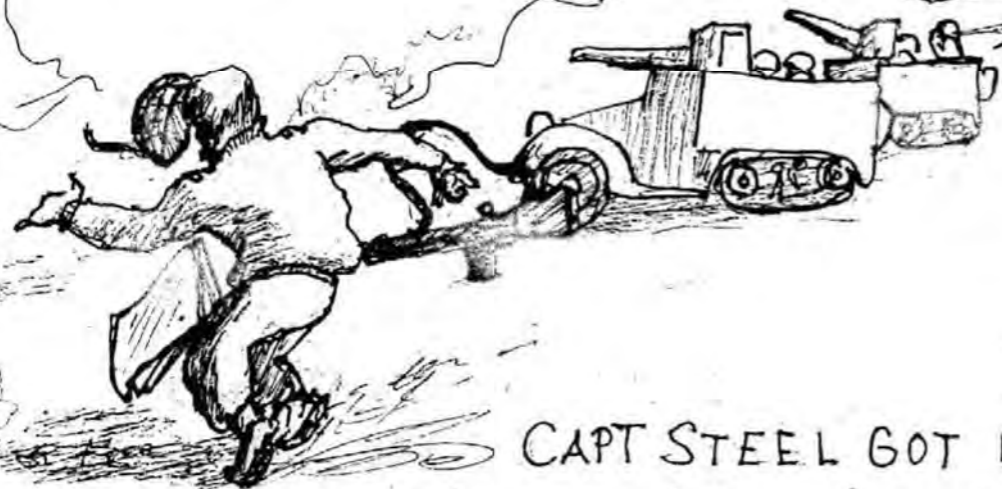
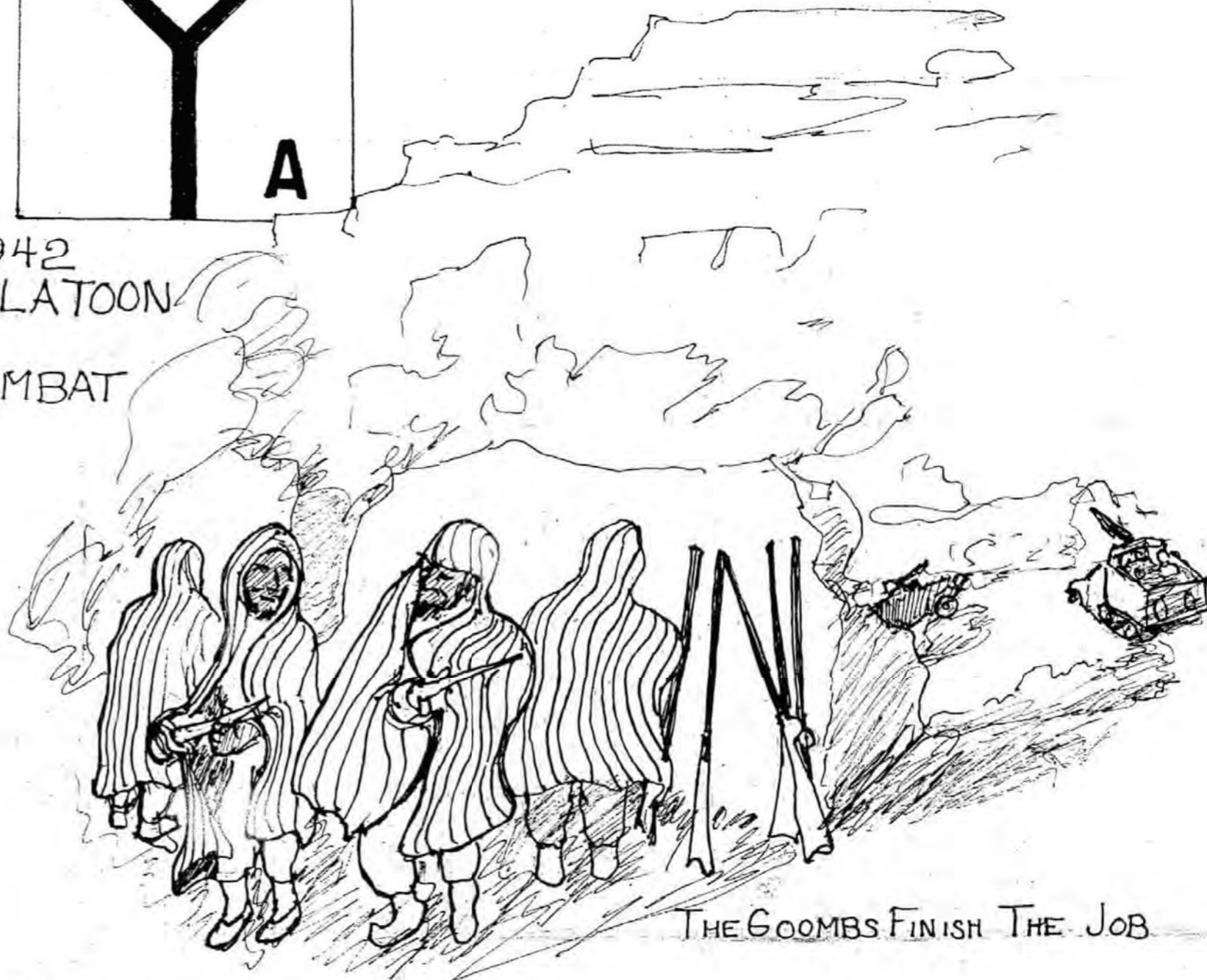

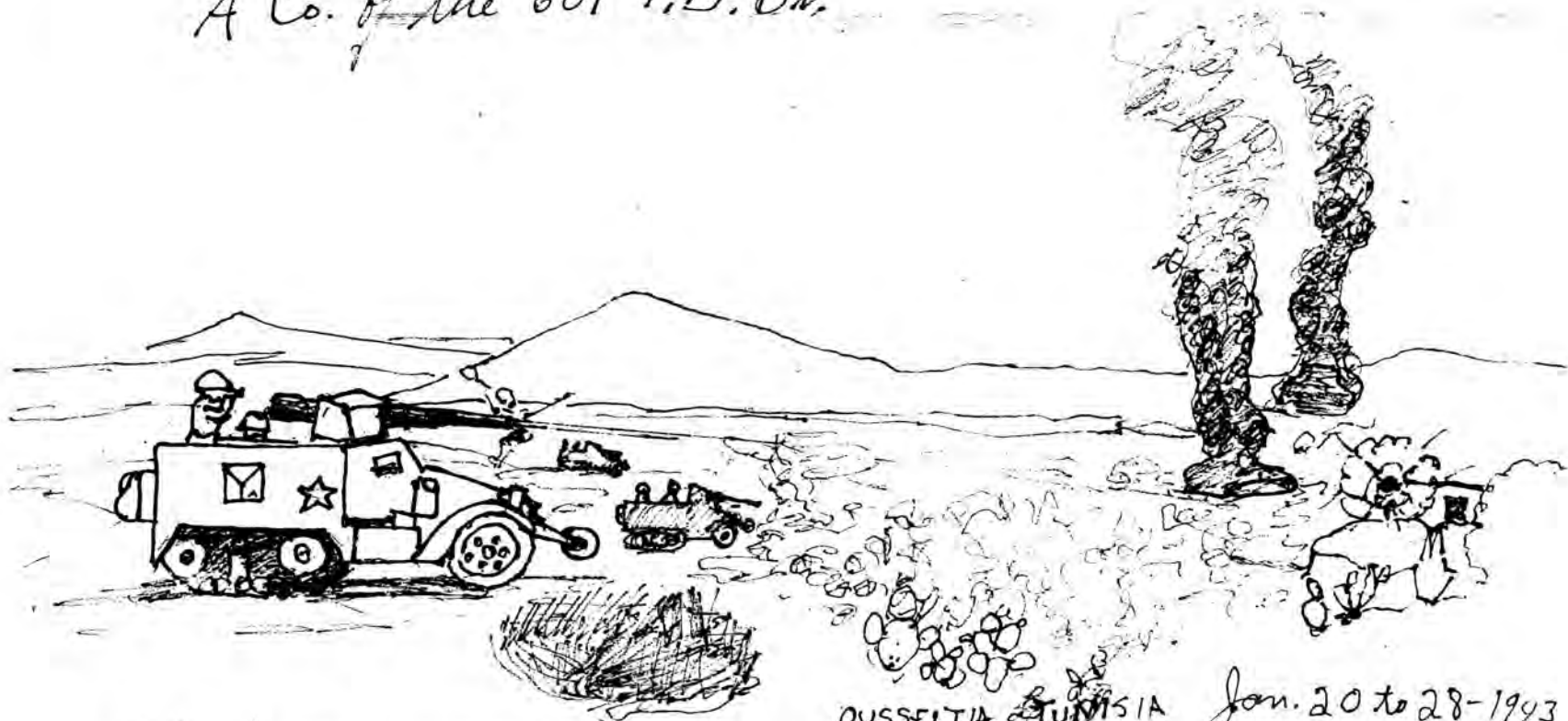


THE GOOMBS FINISH THE JOB

This is the way I remember Dusseitia valley.

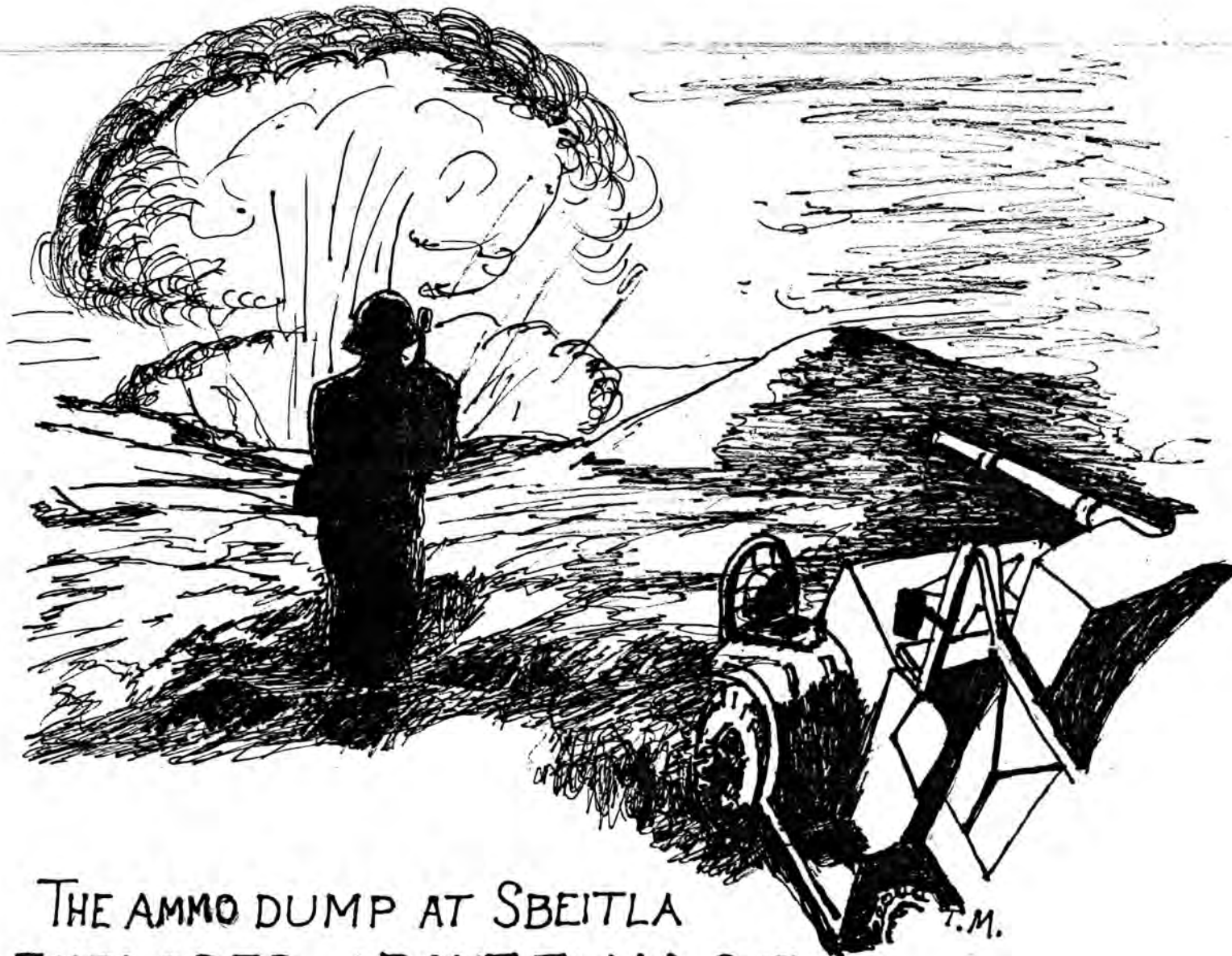
The day before we had been hit by 47 German tanks plus infantry. Needless to say they weren't worried about eight obsolete French 75 mm. guns mounted on a half track.

We spent the night dodging and hiding until the next morning - when sections of the First Armored moved ^{over}



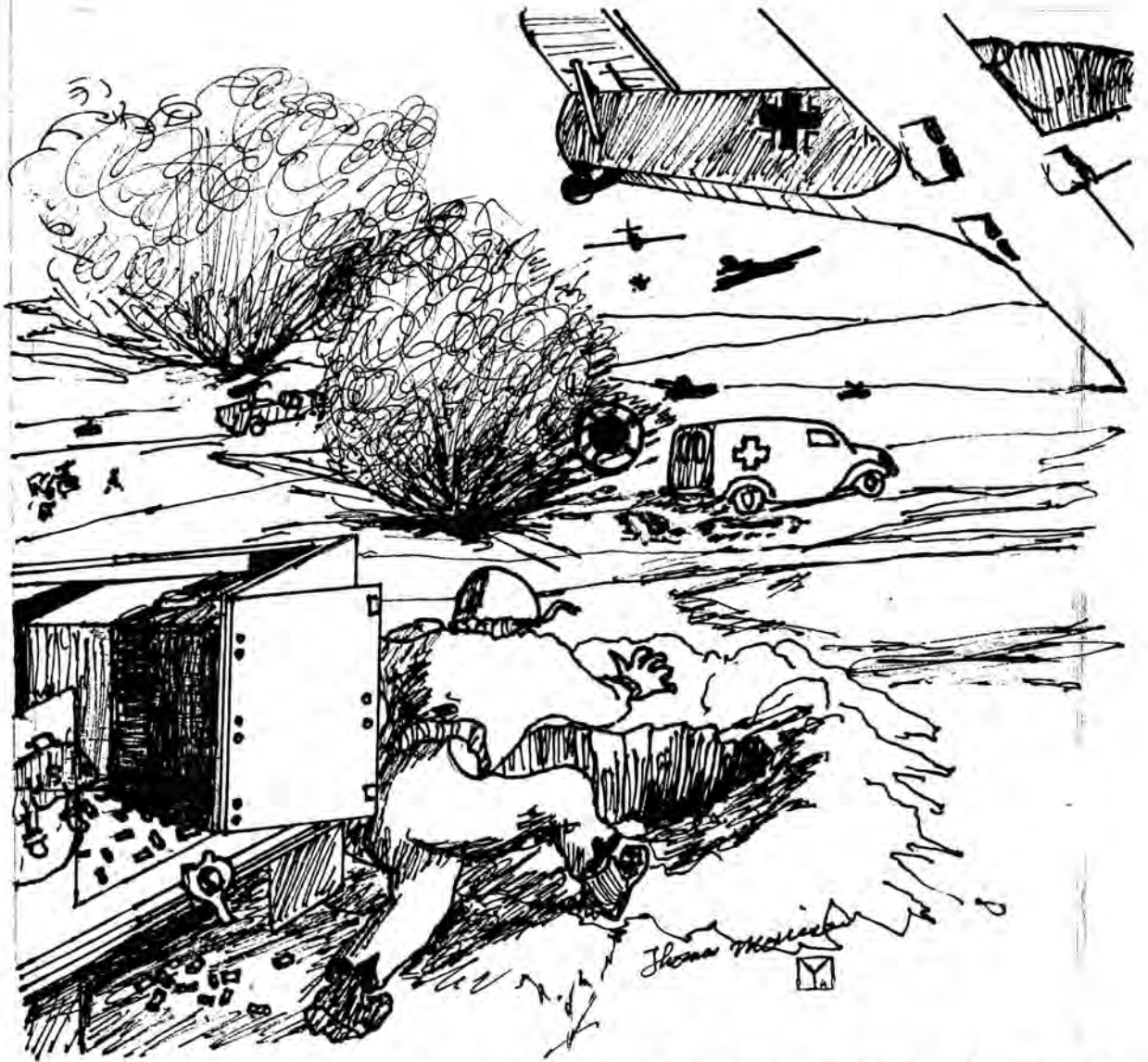
ELEMENTS OF THE 601 T. D. BN. FIGHT A REAR GUARD

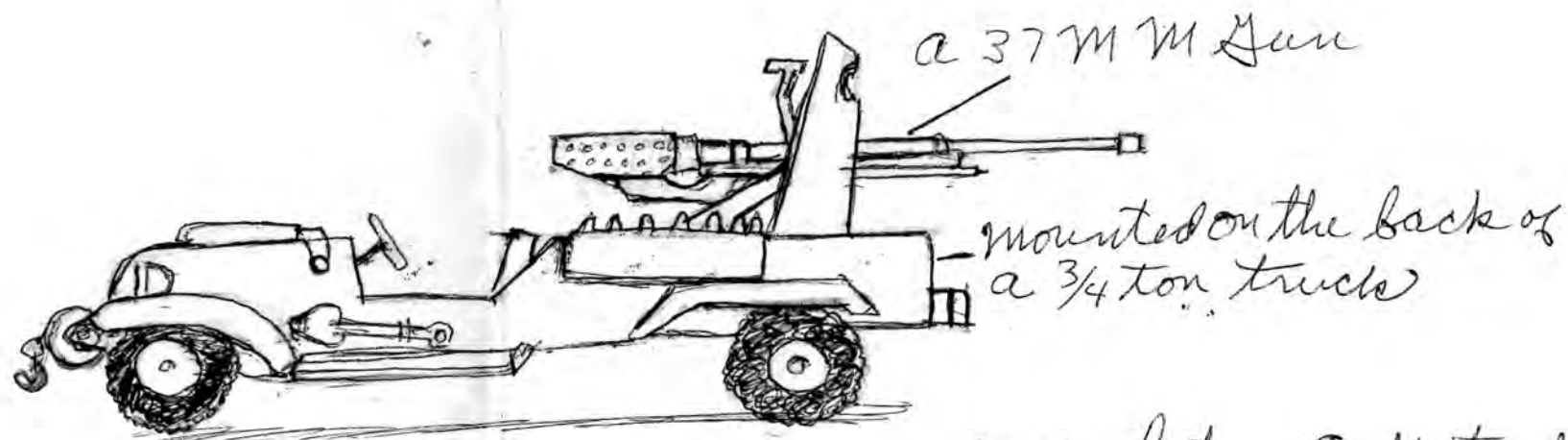


ON THE OPEN PLAINS AT ELGUETTAR 3-20,21,22-43
