House was one occupied by an electrician as the attic was filled with radios, radio parts, and electric utilities.

General: Two armored spearheads of 1st Army rolled 30 miles deeper into Germany, 50 miles from the Rhine. 3rd Army is reported 40 miles across Rhine. 9th US Army extended their bridgehead to 14 miles in depth. 7th Army's bridgehead is now 18 miles long and 4 miles deep. Reported that 1st & 3rd Armies linked up near Lahnstein, southeast of Coblenz. Marshal Rokossovsky's men captured 21,000 Germans in the Danzig pocket on 26 March. Weather for period: cloudy and cool. Visibility: fair.

General: 3rd Armored Div cut sharply north and advanced approximately 55 miles against light resistance. 3rd Army made gains of at least 30 miles. They are clearing the streets of Frankfurt and mopping up in the triangle between Frankfurt, Wiesbaden, and Darmstadt. 7th Army is across the **Maine** river on a wide front. The British in the North are making steady gains and there is a security blackout on their location. The Canadians are having a big scrap in Emmerich.

A Russian offensive is in full swing around Koszeg on the Austro-Hungarian border. All enemy in the pocket Southwest of Koenigsberg have been cleared and the city itself is the next Russian objective. A battle rages in Danzig, half of which is already in Russian hands.

A carrier fleet of British and US vessels is attacking the Ryukyu Islands, South of Japan.

British 2nd Army & 1st US Army units are reported only 38 miles apart. 9th US Army Armored spearheads have driven 60 miles in from their original bridgehead. 3rd Army elements are within 10 miles of Kassel. Red Army forces are reported fighting with 40 miles of Vienna. 5,000 Allied planes hammered enemy railroads and installations from Hamburg to Austria. Weather for period: cloudy and rainy.
