Three enemy tanks and one armored car were definitely destroyed and three other tanks were seriously damaged. On one occasion three radio controlled tanks loaded with TNT were rendered harmless and later captured when the tanks controlling them were forced to retreat so far that the radio control was ineffective. In occupying positions to prevent enemy counterattack the towed three inch guns were often emplace in the infantry front lines. Four guns were moved into the tow of Inden when only six houses were in our hands.

After the Roer River was reached, and before a crossing could be made, the German breakthrough in the Ardennes made it necessary for the 104th Division to broaden its sector to free divisions for use in the south. The large front occupied and the fact that the two main East-West roads to Aachen ran through the division sector made it necessary for this battalion to set up an extremely well organized anti-tank defense. For this purpose the battalion was furnished four extra three inch guns. In addition to these guns, six German 75 mm. P.A.K. and one German 88 mm 。P.A.K. were salvaged and put in position. All of these guns were manned by the battalion and many alternate positions were prepared to halt any possible tank attack.

The year closed with the battalion waiting impatiently for the time when the attack in its sector would again be resumed.
