

In his will he left the 776th T.D. a sum of money to be used for a party at our next reunion. He also requested Betty Liegl to take care of this money and party.




Location of next reunion was dis-







IN FLANDERS FIELDS - by John McCrae

The Author and the Poem - It was Spring 1915. In front-line First Aid Station, dug into a Belgian hillside. John McCrae (1872-1918), a doctor in the Canadian Army, worked tirelessly, dressing wounds and comforting the dying. The battle - one of the bitterest of World War I - had raged for over three weeks. The number of casualties mounted steadily. Day after day, from the hillside dugout, John McCrae looked out on Flanders Fields - on the row upon row of white crosses. Each day they stretched farther toward the horizon. "Have we been sacrificed in vain!" the dead seemed to ask. "You, the living, must continue the struggle for freedom and justice." That was the message which Flanders Fields had for John McCrae. And the message inspired these verses, which have become one of the immortal poems of World War I.

In Flanders Fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row. That mark our places; and in the sky The Larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce hear amid the guns below. Take up our quarrel with the foe!

To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high!

If ye break faith with us who die,
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders Fields.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow
Loved and were loved; and now we lay
In Flanders Fields.
