

# MEMORIAL MASS FOR A. HASCHKE AT ST. ANTHONY'S

Service Honors Memory  
of Cedar Rapids Man  
Killed in Action March 3

A memorial mass was held Wednesday morning, March 21, 1945, at 9:00 o'clock at St. Anthony's church in Cedar Rapids for Cpl. Albert Haschke, who was killed in action March 3, in Germany.

Cpl. Haschke was the son of Frank Haschke of Cedar Rapids.

The Rev. Father Vermuelen officiated at the requiem high mass. Honorably discharged service men and members of the American Legion were in attendance with two Legionnaires as flag-bearers. Following the services the national anthem was sung and taps were sounded.

Abert F. Haschke was born Jan. 22, 1908, one of a set of twins at Cedar Rapids. He attended school at St. Anthony's. Following his school days he helped his father on the farm for a few years. Then Albert with his twin brother, Adolph, farmed what is known as the Kleve ranch.

He was working in a copper mine in Arizona when called to the colors. He was inducted for military service on April 4, 1942, going overseas in August 1944. Albert was the driver of a tank destroyer in which he met his death.

He was preceded in death by a sister, Rosalie, and a brother, Henry, and his mother. He is survived by his father, Frank Haschke, of Cedar Rapids; ten brothers and three sisters, John Haschke, Omaha, Lawrence Haschke, Cedar Rapids, Cpl. Frank Haschke, Jr., England, his twin brother, Adolph Haschke, Germany; Sgt. Richard Haschke, somewhere overseas; (Irene) Sister Dadg. of St. Raphael, Omaha, Geo. Haschke, Rockford, Ill., Edwin Haschke, somewhere overseas, Gilbert Haschke, Seattle, Wash., Arnold Haschke, Rockford, Ill., (Margaret) Sister Madg. of Mount Carmel, Leona Haschke, Rockford, Ill., and Pvt. Anthony Haschke, Parris Island, S. C. Besides these brothers and sisters, a host of other relatives and friends mourn his death.

His winning smile and pleasant

disposition will be greatly missed by many.
