As a last word you are reminded that it has always been the objective of the Battalion Commander and staff to "get the job done" and "give every one the best break possible". If we have succeeded even to a small extent, we are well rewarded for the effort expended.

Since this is undoubtedly the last opportunity of reaching all the men and officers who have served in the Battalion, I wish to say goodbye to all and hope that many of us will encounter other ex-631 men during the years to come. Just to be sure that this is possible, this final issue of the "Rag" will carry the home address of every officer and man.

When you reach home don't carry a chip on your shoulder. Take it easy and you will soon be back in the swing.

Changed to Cat. IV

The 631st is going home!

Climaxing a week of rapid developments in which the unit category was changed from II to IV was the announcement that early next month the battalion will be ready to roll to an Assembly Area. To what camp the Battalion would go, its actual sailing date and port of embarkation, was not disclosed.

To be Inactivated

It is expected that the Battalion will be located at an Assembly Area in the vicinity of Paris for a period of three weeks. Passes will be given up to 17%, it is understood. After an additional week in a Staging Area the Battalion will sail for home, and should arrive well in advance of Christmas. At the state-side Staging Area it will be inactivated, its personnel broken down into groups for shipment to separation centers throughout the states. There personnel will be mustered out or given furloughs.

Low Pointers Leave Today

Approximately 670 men will leave the ETO with the 631st, comprising a full T/O and 10% overstrength. Additional personnel, eligible to return home, will be acquired before the unit departs. Each company will consist in a headquarters section and two platoons of 60 men each. Today 3 officers and 45 enlisted men, all having 64 points or less, were transferred to the 9th Traffic Regulating Group at Schorn-dorf. 50 others left for the 6th TD Brigade, while 5 men joined Military Government. The shipment of men scheduled to leave October 4th has been cancelled.

Packing Starts

Immediately on receipt of the alert orders the familiar routine necessitated by imminent shipment will be set in motion. Unit schools have already closed, packing and preparation of equipment to be turned in commenced, and the "Tiger Rag" has gone to press for the last time. At week's end the Battalion was buzzing with anticipation and raring to go.

weekend passes (ha) and furloughs — The smell of salt air and sight of new lands. Now it's all rapidly drawing to a close.

We are all about to start that "Sentimental Journey" home. The former "Rag" staff and those of us presently assigned take this opportunity to wish all a fond farewell, Bon Voyage, God Speed, wherever — and don't forget us, fellas.

He wasn't out horsing around or carrying on jokes with the gang. I believe he was off in a corner by himself writing home when I struck up a conversation with him.

We became great friends from the start. Although we were of two most opposite types, our friendship lasted always. This guy, I knew, didn't seem like the type for the Army. When the gang was having a big time at the P.X. he was up writing to his mom or else sitting alone in the Chapel. Definitely a quiet sort of guy—but tops.

All through basic we helped one another out on tests and exams. This companionship between us seemed to grow stronger and stronger as time went by.

Whenever either of us had a particular problem or got into a little jam, we went to one another for that "Buddy Advice" that helps so much.

I'll never forget the day when we both got letters from our girls telling us they had found someone new. The world looked pretty dark then, but we had each other to turn to. There we were, two guys in the same boat.

Time went by and the Army grew dreary. Then our Cpl. ratings came in, both together. A happy-go-lucky guy and a serious minded fellow, both given our first sense of responsibility.

How we studied and prepared for our first classes in instruction for the new rookies. He on the '03 and me on the .50 cal. The midnight oil was burned weeks in advance. Finally the day came when we were to give our first class—nerves on edge. It was over quickly and we had put it over, our impression was made. Two very happy buck Cpls., were we that night.

Shortly after that I was married, but he stayed single. The right girl hadn't come along for him yet.

We were lucky to stick together when we came overseas. Our friendship was a thing that wouldn't have been broken up by any manner or means. Here we were out on pass—two G.I.s far, far away from home. This is when we really realized just how close we were. It's just one of those things you can't describe but we both knew it was true.
