

Sutliff Is Killed

Sgt. Earle R. Sutliff, 24, was killed in action on March 4, according to a War Department telegram received by his mother, Mrs. Mary K. Lane, 73½ Broad Street, Glens Falls.

Inducted into the service on Feb. 12, 1942, Sgt. Sutliff served with the First Army in the 703rd Tank Division. He received basic training at Camp Polk, La., at camps at Temple, Tex., and in California, Camp Pickett, Va., Indiantown Gap, Pa., and finally at Camp Killmer, N. J., from where he was sent overseas on Sept. 5, 1943.

After arriving overseas, Sgt. Sutliff was stationed in England and on D-Day went to France.

Mrs. Lane has another son, Cpl. Charles Sutliff, serving in Germany with the Third Army.

Besides his mother and brother, Sgt. Sutliff is survived by one sister, Mrs. Thomas McIntosh, 73½ Broad Street.

A letter received recently by Mrs. Lane from General Marshall expressed his deepest sympathy and stated that Sgt. Sutliff fought gallantly until his death.
